GENERAL REHABILITATION: The environment affected by the mining operations will be rehabilitated by the holder, as far as is practicable, to its natural state or to a predetermined and agreed to standard or land use which conforms with the concept of sustainable development. The affected environment will be maintained in a stable condition that will not be detrimental to the safety and health of humans and animals and that will not pollute the environment or lead to the degradation thereof. All gates and fences erected by the holder which is not required by the landowner/tenant, will be removed and the situation restored to the pre mining situation. **EXCAVATION AREA:** Due to the impracticality of importing large volumes of fill to restore the quarry area to its original topography, the rehabilitation option is to develop the quarry into a minor landscape feature thereby reducing the overall face angle or sloping the quarry to an acceptable slope as recommended by the DMRE. Fill and topsoil was placed over the slopes to provide a suitable medium for the establishment of vegetation. **FINAL REHABILITATION:** All infrastructure, equipment, plant, temporary housing and other items used during the mining period will be removed from the site (section 44 of the MPRDA) Waste material of any description, including receptacles, scrap, rubble and tyres, will be removed entirely from the mining area and disposed of at a recognised landfill facility. It will not be permitted to be buried or burned on the site.





